#### Albarino, Pazo de Senorans, Rias Baixas, 2016, Spain

Owned by the husband and wife team Soledad Bueno and Javier Mareque, they have become the leading producer of Albariño in Rias Baixas and are widely recognised as one of Spain's finest producers. They have won international acclaim for their mineral-driven Albariños from their vineyards close to the Atlantic and for the fantastic ageing potential of these wines. Aromas of nectarine, fresh figs, orange zest and white flowers. Dry, citrus flavours and a mineral-driven finish, which expands and deepens on the tail end. Offering a satisfying balance of power and finesse

#### Cerasuolo di Vittoria, Gulfi, DOCG, Sicily, 2015, Italy

Organic winemaker Vito Catania comes from a proud tradition of vine growers in his native Sicily. This young winemaker is based in Ragusa, the 'home' of Nero d'Avola. He focuses on terroir specific, single vineyard bottlings of Sicily's signature red varietal. Since he started the wines have demonstrated huge potential through the combination of old bush vines, careful site selection and his exceptional winemaking. Regularly receiving Tre Bicchieri awards from the Gambero Rosso, Gulfi was also named 'Winery of the Year' by the Guide to the Best Italian wines in 2012. Frappato and Nero d'Avola, together in their authentic terroir. A wine in which structure, freshness and fragrance are in perfect harmony. Intense and fruity on the nose with hints of watermelon and strawberries, this is a delightful red wine. Delicate, dry, and incredibly fresh and playful. A true pleasure to drink.

<b>Chenin Blanc, The Veldt Range, 2016, South Africa</b> Aromas reminiscent of melon & lychees with soft tropical fruit.	21.95
<b>Sauvignon Blanc, Montes, Casablanca, 2016, Chile</b> Intense aromatics of herbs and cut grass on the nose, with grapefruit, lime and white peach on the palate	24.95
<b>Muscadet, La Roche blanche, Domaine des Herbauges, 2016, France</b> Bottled straight of the lees to add extra complexity makes this classic bone dry white wine the perfect companion to shellfish & seafood.	25.95
<b>Pinot Grigio, Tolloy, Sudtirolo, Alto Adige, 2016, Italy</b> A complex pinot grigio with an intense & ample bouquet that transitions from nuances of pear, white peach & melon to delicate floral notes, hand selected grapes from the Italian Dolomites	27.95

<b>Rioja Blanco, Campillo, Fermentado en Barrica, 2016, Spain</b> This wine brings the freshness and vigour of youth and the nuances provided by its stay for 41 days in fine French oak.	27.95
<b>Vernaccia di San Gimignano, Alata, Rampa di Fugnano, DOCG, 2015, Italy</b> Grown around the eponymous hilltop town near Siena. Fruity and pleasantly soft on the palate, with distinct almond & apple flavours that continue on the finish. This unique variety is known for being taut and zesty, but also slightly honeyed in character.	26.95
<b>Sauvignon Blanc, Tinpot Hut, 2016, New Zealand</b> Aromas of passion fruit, blackcurrant, lemongrass and fresh thyme make this a truly stunning example of a Marlborough Sauvignon.	32.95
<b>Vermentino di Sardegna DOC, Tino, Mora &amp; Memo, 2015, Italy</b> The best vermentino comes from Sardinia & this is the best vermentino in Sardinia. Floral lift on the nose with a great oily texture of stone fruit.	32.95
<b>Petit Chablis, Domaine Millet, 2015, France</b> The nose is classic Petit Chablis; stony and mineral but also lightly honeyed. The palate is tangy with crushed sea-shell and stone fruit and the acidity is crisp, balancing the richness of the palate	35.95

<b>Casal de Armán, Blanco, DO Ribeiro, 2013, Spain</b>	33.95
From Galicia this family estate produces a wine of exceptional quality from unusual grape varieties such as Treixadura, Godello and Albariño, Tasty, fresh, unctuous and structured. Exotic fruit scents, grapefruit, fresh herbs, mint and a perfectly integrated acidity and finish.	
<b>Chardonnay, Strandwolf, B.Vinters, Stellembosch, 2015, South Africa</b>	38.95
The wine has a citrus core of fresh limes, which is well defined with crunchy apple and pineapple. Salinity and mineral elements reveals itself on the palate with delicate oak spice adding complexity. The wine remains fresh, yet restraint, with great length and depth as a result of some 10 months lees contact.	
<b>Gavi di Gavi, Iugarara, Giustiniana, DOCG, 2015, Italy</b>	36.95
Tight, nervy and full of energy, and with a delicious core of tongue-teasing preserved lemon and juicy white apple flesh, this is a superior example of the Cortese grape.	
<b>Lugana, I Frati, Ca dei Frati, 2015, Italy</b>	39.95
Light yellow in colour with a concentrated but fresh perfume of white flowers, peaches and ripe lemons. On the palate it has excellent depth and balance, with lovely richness and a crisp, lively finish. A stunning wine from Lake Garda.	
<b>Chablis, Domaine Vincent Dampt, 2015, France</b>	42.95
Citrus and white fruits with a hint of minerality on the finish. Its nice balance and complexity comes from old vines. Vincent Dampt is one of Chablis' rising stars. The youngest generation of an impressive Chablis lineage, Vincent is the son of Daniel Dampt and grandson of Jean Defaix, both admired Chablis producers.	
<b>Sancerre, Domaine Nozay, 2015, France</b>	42.95
Ripe grapefruit aromas which are also very limestone and flinty in character. Attractive mouthfilling texture with real substance and breadth. Quite a serious style here which shows in the finish, charged with zippy, crunchy structure.	
<b>One Man Band, Iona, Elgin, 2015, South Africa</b>	44.95
Classic Bordeaux blend of sauvignon & semillion. Lovely pure fruit, elegant and vibrant. Floral with white stone fruit and blackcurrant. Tangerine lingers on the mid palate with a long savoury finish of pea shoots, fine herbs and sea breeze	
<b>Rully, La Chatalienne, Olivier Leflaive, 2013, France</b>	45.95
Fine, clear, lemon-and-lime in appearance, with a classy, detailed nose, this has lovely integration between fruit and barrel. It fills the mouth, and extends to an enjoyable finish.	
<b>Soave Classico, La Rocca, Pieropan, 2014, Italy</b>	47.95
Classic La Rocca aromas of almond essence and honey lead to an elegant and beautifully balanced palate, with notes of vanilla and almond kernel, ripe apricots and exotic fruit. The long finish has a light mineral edge.	
<b>Macon Verze, Domaine Leflaive, 2015, France</b>	59.95
Domaine Leflaive's Mâcon Verzé is made in the same way as their great Puligny's, but comes at a fraction of the price. It has Leflaive's trademark balance between weight and minerality and is stunningly complex and satisfying.

<b>Cotes de Provence Rose, Chateau Tour de L'Eveque, 2015</b>	29.95
La Source Gabriel Rose is a blend of Grenache, Cinsault and Syrah that is organically grown in the classic provence style.	
<b>Rosa Dei Frati, Ca dei Frati, Riviera del Garda, 2014, Italy</b>	38.95
Stunning rose, from the shores of Lake Garda, A delicate salmon pink wine that is fresh but full of flavour, showing delicate red berry fruit. Poise and balance in this structured rosé, with a final, persistent note.

<b>Sangiovese Rubicon, Azienda Vincola Arche 2016, Italy</b>	17.95
This is a lovely soft, spicy Sangiovese. Dark ruby in colour with herbaceous cherries and violets on the nose.	
<b>Carignan, Vieilles Vignes, Mont Rocher, 2015, France</b>	21.95
100% carignan from old vines producing a well-structured wine with dark berry fruit & spice on the palate with a zingy & uplifting finish.	
<b>Merlot, Montes, Colchagua Valley, 2015, Chile</b>	24.95
Vibrant ruby red in colour, this plummy Merlot has hints of vanilla and chocolate with velvety tannins, crisp acidity and a fragrant finish.	
<b>Mencia, Merayo, DO Bierzo, 2015, Spain</b>	24.95
From 80yr old vineyards, this red has all the fresh, perfumed characters and ripe red fruit typical of Mencia.	
<b>Cotes du Rhone, Le Reveur, Guillaume Gonnet, 2015, France</b>	26.95
A blend of Grenache & Syrah, soft but full flavoured with great structure to support the ample fruit.	
<b>Primativo, Criteri, Schola Sarmienti, Salento, 2015, Italy</b>	27.95
This has all the wonderful primativo traits and more. An intense fragrance of rich, dark berry fruit and subtle spice. Well structured and warm, this full bodied red has a classic Italian finish with fine chewy tannins.	
<b>Shiraz, Thistledown, Langhorne Creek, 2014, Australia</b>	28.95
Great depth of ripe plum and blackberry fruit flavours. A full bodied wine with a succulent palate, lively spices and fine velvety tannins.	
<b>Carmenere Reserve, Barrel Select, Santa Ema, 2014, Chile</b>	27.95
This epitomises the value and quality which Chile can offer. Superb balance and concentration of black cherries, herbs, spicy black pepper and a touch of chocolate.	
<b>Rufete, Quinta de Cidro, Douro, 2011, Portugal</b>	33.95
The Rufete grape reveals an ability to age and produces quite exotic reds. Very round, soft in tannins, medium-bodied but very elegant with aromas of red and black berries.	
<b>Pinot Noir, Tinpot Hut, Marlborough 2015, New Zealand</b>	33.95
Aromatics of ripe cherry & plum shine through to the palate & are complimented by subtle spicy notes, silky & lingering finish.	
<b>Malbec, Zuccardi Q, Mendoza, 2014, Argentina</b>	34.95
Deep red, with complex aromas of ripe red fruits. Dark plums and blackberries combine with notes of vanilla and coffee. This expressive wine has firm, sweet tannins giving a delightful finish.	
<b>Rioja Reserva, Bodegas Luis Canas 2011, Spain</b>	36.95
A delicious Reserva from one of the top Rioja Bodegas. It has a dark berry fruit nose and an elegant, flavourful blackberry and raspberry palate together with complex layers of oak, cocoa and balsam hints. It displays very good structure, real elegance and length.	
<b>Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, Farnese, Colline Teramane, DOCG, 2009, Italy</b>	39.95
Intense and persistent with a spicy bouquet, and hints of chocolate and tar that complement the vibrant dark fruit character. On the palate it is very well balanced and displays great structure and tannins.	

<b>One Man Band, Iona, Elgin, 2010, South Africa</b>	45.95
Syrah, Cab Sauv & Merlot grapes are blended here to produce a delicious silky smooth warming wine with spice and gentle game notes. Layered with fragrant sweet, ripe cherry and blackberry flavours, with almond and white pepper tones. Great with red meat.	
<b>Cair, Dominio de Cair Crianza, Ribero del Duero, 2011, Spain</b>	49.95
One of the most award winning wines from the Ribero. Elegant and refined, with an intense and complex nose of blackcurrant fruit, leather and dark chocolate and a wonderfully complex and succulent palate of blackfruits with well integrated oak. This wine demonstrates how power and finesse can be brilliantly combined; the flavours go on and on.	
<b>Shiraz. G.A.M, Mitolo, McLaren Vale, 2013, Australia</b>	59.95
Intense crimson. Black cherry, plum, subtle mint characters and chocolate with distinct notes of malt, cedar and clove. Bright blackberry and plum on the palate with quality oak flavours of mocha and vanilla. Soft tannins and deep flavours continue on the long finish.	
<b>Pinot Noir, Moonlight Race, Burn Cottage, Central Otago, 2014, New Zealand</b>	69.95
A myriad of mulberry, wild thyme and enticing savoury undertones are interwoven with layers of ripe summer berries. The palate displays both generosity and restraint, with plump and supple tannins that are supported by an amalgam of summer ripened plums, dark cherry and a freshness reminiscent of ripe red fruits. The finish is long, the wine showing lovely fruit purity and definition.	
<b>Volnay, Vieilles Vignes, Maison Roche de Bellene, 2010, France</b>	69.95
A brilliant expression of perfumed, elegant pinot noir. The nose is most inviting with fresh red and black fruits and a hint of violet and rose petals, whilst the palate has soft, velvety tannins and a touch of spice.	
<b>Amarone della Valpolicella Classico, Tommasi, 2012, Italy</b>	69.95
Family owned winery using their hillside vineyards for the production of this rich classic wine. Displaying ripe plum and black cherry fruit with notes of mocha, raisin and mineral on the soft luscious finish.	
<b>Serpico, Mitolo, Cabernet Sauvignon, McLaren Vale, 2013, Australia</b>	69.95
Serpico, the flagship Mitolo Cabernet, is made using the Amarone technique of drying grapes before fermentation. This process concentrates flavour contributing mid palate plushness, complexity and mouth coating yet silky tannins. It's a unique wine that is rich and structured yet has the balance of elements crucial to the Mitolo style.	
<b>Caiarossa, Rosso di Toscana IGT, Caiarossa, 2006, Italy</b>	79.00
Situated in the heart of the Val di Cecina, on the Tuscan coast. The winery was founded in 1998 and it was eventually acquired in 2004 by Eric Albada Jelgersma, a Dutch entrepreneur with a great passion for wine and also the owner of Château Giscours and Château du Tertre - two Grand Crus classé in Margaux, Bordeaux. 23% Sangiovese, 22% Cabernet Franc, 21% Merlot, 12% Cabernet Sauvignon. 8% Alicante, 6% Syrah, 6% Petit Verdot and 2% Mourvedre. Aromas of flowers, berries, nuts and mineral. Full-bodied, with chewy tannins and pretty fruit. A hints of wood on the palate, this wine has developed beautifully. Bordeaux meets Tuscany !	

## Reserve List

- Meursault Blagny 1er Cru, Domaine Matrot, France, 2012** 89.00  
Thierry Matrot's Meursault Blagny soars beyond recent feats. The nose, initially, is rather reserved, just hinting at orchard fruit. Proust would love the palate, reminiscent of warm madeleines and slightly almondy, warm cake. Opulent, with a lovely texture and old, vine fruit concentration, this has a good structure - silky through to a long finish
- Puligny Montrachet, Les Meix, Olivier Leflaive, 2014, France** 79.00  
Located just beneath the renowned premier cru village of Pucelles, Les Meix has some of that enviable bone structure. Upright and dynamic, the wine starts with notes of white flowers and ripe, creamy fruit before the characteristic laser-beam of acidity breaks on the mid-palate in a wave of energy. The finish is long and crystalline, with the familiar tang of saline on the finish.
- Chateau Beaucastel, Chateauneuf Du Pape Rouge, 2009, France** 115.00  
Beaucastel is one of the top properties in Châteauneuf-du-Pape. Year after year, they produce a multidimensional, age-worthy wine. Although Mourvèdre and Grenache, at about 30% each, comprise the majority of the blend, Beaucastel uses all 13 grape varieties permitted in the appellation, which may explain the phenomenal complexity of their wines, especially the 2009.
- Pinot Noir, There are still mysteries, The Drift Farm, Overberg Highlands, 2012, South Africa** 79.00  
Driven by a desire to make individual, superb quality wines with exceptional character The Drift wines are carefully crafted by winemaker Bruce Jack using only grapes grown on the farm. The nose shows an intriguing blend of just-ripe strawberry and blueberry, wrapped up in spring herbs and dark chocolate oak. The palate echoes the ripe, red forest fruits of the nose, and also reflects the subtle and complexing herbaceous characters. The tannins are creamy, long and persistent
- Brunello de Montalcino, Sesti Castello di Argiano, 2004, Italy** 109.00  
Along with Chianti, Brunello di Montalcino is Tuscany's most famous DOCG and its boldest expression of the Sangiovese grape. Located 30 miles south of Siena, its 2,000 hectares of vines are hemmed in by the Orcia, Asso and Ombrone valleys. Brunello is the local name for the Sangiovese Grosso clone from which Brunello di Montalcino should be made in its entirety. The wine cannot be released for sale until five years after the harvest. A special treat to savour 2004.
- Chateau Magdelaine, Saint Emillion, Premier Grand Cru Classe, 1995, France** 129.00  
Magdelaine had 10.4 hectares of vineyards, of which six were on the famous St Emilion limestone ridge (very close to Ch. Ausone) and the remainder on clay- and limestone-based slopes. Merlot performs particularly well on these limestone-rich soils and at Magdelaine it is the dominant grape, making up 90 percent of the blend – a higher proportion than is found in any other Premier Grand Cru Classé from St Emilion.
- Chateau Léoville-Barton, St Julien, 2007, France** 115.00  
One of the most famous estates in St. Julien, Leoville-Barton and its sister estate Langoa-Barton are the two St. Julien properties that have the longest continuous duration of ownership by the same family of any properties in Bordeaux. The plantings are 72% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot, and 8% Cabernet Franc with the vines averaging 30 years of age. The 2007 is a solid, powerful wine. The velvety softness of the oak dances on the tongue, followed by a dense concentration of the classic 'left bank' nose of smoky blackberry fruit, leather and pencil lead. The palate is rich and rounded with assertive tannins, ample fruit and well integrated oak.
